You have created 3 paragraphs that all have a different "feeling" to them. All are good. Number 1 is the most direct and the simplest. It would be a good student answer to an essay question. Number 2 feels a lot more personal. I would expect to read something like this as a personal essay or in a magazine rather than in response to a school assignment (although it would be fine as an essay answer too). And for number 3 you have found a middle-ground between these two, which I think is a very nice blend. I would not say any of them is the "best" because each of them has a strength that the other does not, but they certainly have a different feeling and would be appropriate for different uses or when you are trying to emphasize different parts of your writing.
